

1. Literacy assessment

This assessment task will assess whether the learners have understood and can apply the concepts taught in this theme. Over the last two weeks learners:

- listened to the story *Ntombi Hippo*
- demonstrated understanding of the above story
- identified the 'e' sound at the beginning of words
- sang and recited songs
- described various items of clothing and when they are worn
- read the sentence strips with the teacher and class
- practised the letter formation of the letter 'e'
- used language for learning

This assessment task may take several days to complete. You can do it one-to-one with the learner or in a small group.

TASK

Part one

- Use the letter formation assessment wheel to assess this activity.
- Put the letter 'e' and the other letters introduced so far from the Learner Resource Book on a table.
- Ask each learner to find the letter 'e'. Ask the learner to find the other letters, one at a time.
- Let the learner read each letter.
- Now ask each learner to trace the letter 'e', saying what they are doing. Check that they start and end in the correct positions.
- Finally ask learners if they know words that begin with 'e'. Remember to say the sound and not the name, i.e. 'eh' not 'eee'.

Part two

- Use clothing from the theme table for this task.
- Ask the learner to identify and describe the various items of clothing.
- Ask the learner to name the season in which we would wear the clothes.
- Ask the learner to describe the place/occasion when such clothes would be worn.

Part three

- Use the sentence strip: *I have a ___ (scarf, hat, shirt, etc.)*
- Place the ending words and matching pictures (or clothes) on the table.
- Ask: "What do I have in my suitcase?" and point to a picture. The learner replies "I have a ___" and matches the name label and the item of clothing.
- Let the learner make the sentence. Have the learner read the sentence together with you, pointing to each word as you read.

2. Numeracy assessment

This assessment task will assess whether the learners have understood and can apply the concepts taught in this theme. Over the last two weeks learners:

- counted to 10
- were introduced to the number 5/five
- were introduced to the oval shape
- began to conceptualise the concept of equal sharing and grouping to 6
- worked concretely comparing and ordering objects using appropriate vocabulary to describe length (e.g. long, longer, short, shorter, etc.).

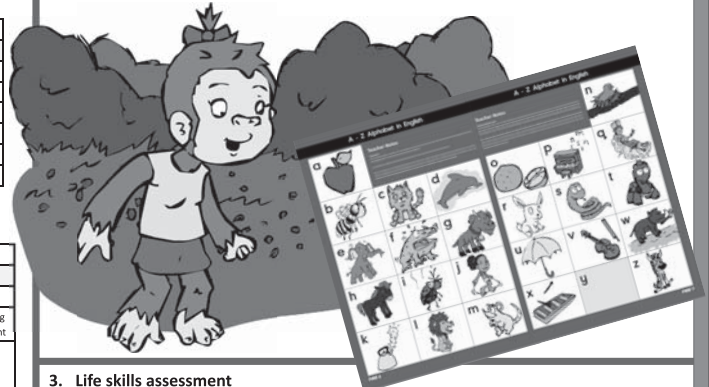
This assessment task may take several days to complete. You can do it one-to-one with the learner or in a small group.

TASK

- Give the learner a pile of socks. Ask the learner to count them all. How many?
- The learner must then pair up the socks, and count the pairs. How many?
- Ask the learner to describe the socks in terms of length: Which one is longer, shorter, the shortest, the widest, etc.

3. Life skills assessment

Over the last two weeks learners engaged in various life skills-linked activities that required them to learn all about what we wear. They described various items of clothing in terms of their function and occasion. Learners were also introduced to the different materials used to make clothes.

Show learners the following pictures and ask them to:

- name the various items of clothing
- explain who would wear each item and why
- identify the season in which we would wear the clothing
- describe where we would wear the clothing, and for what occasion

See if learners are able to apply what they have learnt over the past two weeks when looking at these pictures.
