2008 National Senior Certificate (NSC) Examination Timetable

In recent years the Grade 12 examinations have started in early October. This has meant that many precious days are lost to teaching and learning. Learners have had a number of days between examinations, which are not maximally used. For Grade 12 learners and other learners in high schools this has had negative consequences for quality education and high-level achievement.

In 2008 the Grade 12 examinations will start in the first week of November. This maximises your opportunity to learn and succeed. Please study the timetable and begin to prepare for success today. You may have to write two examinations on one day but remember this is a requirement at university and in other countries. Also remember in the workplace there are no half-days.

Writing two exams per day will mean good time management and healthy bodies and minds. Get in shape for success today. We will provide you with loads of tips and exemplar papers to help you. Get your Study Mate every week from now until end-October.

1. The first National Certificate (NSC) examination, based on the National Curriculum Statement (NCS) will be administered in Grade 12 in November 2008.

2. The Inter-Provincial Examination Committee (IPEC) compiled the National Examinations Timetable after consultation with all education stakeholders and religious organisations. This timetable was endorsed by the Heads of Education Committee (HEDCOM) and finally approved by the Council of Education Ministers (CEM).
3. Subjects are scheduled to be written, from 3 November 2008 to 3 December 2008.

4. Two sessions are scheduled everyday. The morning session will commence at 9:00 and the afternoon session will commence at 14:00.

5. Information Technology Paper 1 (Practical) and Computer Applications Technology, Paper 1 (Practical), together with all the Non Official Languages will be written between 29 and 31 October 2008.

10 things to do to succeed in the Grade 12 examinations

Check how ready you are for your matric examinations.

Did you know?

1. **The final matric timetable is out**
See the timetable opposite and start to plan now. There are sometimes two exams on one day so you will have to be super sharp and alert. See page 2.

2. **There are 230 days to the start of final exams**
This includes all weekends and holidays. Start today and work everyday. Set targets for achievement. See the block on results on the right.

3. **There are 160 days of school left before the exams begin**
Do not miss one day. Keep healthy and alert (See below). Listen to your teachers. They have done this before and will help you succeed.

4. **Reading is a hot skill**
Reading will change your life. Read at least 1 000 words everyday. Read everything you can get your hands on. Read accurately and quickly.

5. **Writing is power. But it requires practice**
We are all judged, every day, on our writing – we can inspire, impress, persuade, congratulate and express love with writing. Write at least 400 words everyday – carefully, accurately and beautifully.

6. **Textbooks are an essential student companion**
Have you got a textbook for each subject? Make sure you do and that

you work systematically though your textbooks. Don't wait for your teacher to explain it all. Look at what you have to cover for the year and plan accordingly.

7. **Your BMI can help you in matric**
Your Body Mass Index (BMI) is an indication of how healthy you are. Calculate your BMI and then exercise and eat healthily throughout the year to keep an optimum BMI.

8. **Academic work requires concentration and focus**
Everyday you should be engaged in intensive, focused, individual academic work. Turn off iPods, music centres, the TV, the cellphone and have an intensive and rewarding academic workout everyday. Build your brain cells and be the envy of all your friends.

9. **Good vibes are good for success**
Surround yourself with positive, happy people who want you to succeed. Your family and friends will be important in supporting you in the next 230 days. Be grateful for their support.

10. **Matric success requires planning and hard work**
Start planning and working today. Attend school everyday. Do homework every day. Read everyday Write and calculate everyday. Draw up a year plan before the end of March and stick to it.

- ## Diet and academic performance
- ### Did you know?
- Your diet can affect your ability to perform academically. Malnutrition (inadequate diet, hunger, nutritional deficiencies) can result in decreased attentiveness, motivation and other behaviors that affect school performance. Even short-term nutritional deficiencies can influence one's ability to concentrate and to perform complex tasks. Skipping even one meal can negatively affect one's problem-solving ability and low energy intake at breakfast can have a negative effect on creativity. Deficiencies in specific nutrients such as iron also have an immediate effect on the ability to concentrate.
- Body Mass Index (BMI)** is an indicator of the level of under- or over-nutrition (total body fat) compared to an individual's ideal weight. It is calculated using a person's height and weight in the following formula: weight in kg divided by height in metres squared (weight (kg)/height (m)²). A BMI measure of 20-25 is considered healthy.
- #### Body Mass Index norms
- | BMI norms (17-26 years of age) | Rating |
|--------------------------------|-------------|
| under 20 | Underweight |
| 20–25 | Healthy |
| 25–30 | Overweight |
| Over 30 | Obese |
- #### How to calculate Body Mass Index
- The formula for calculating BMI is:
- $$\text{BMI} = \frac{\text{weight (kg)}}{\text{height (m)}^2}$$
- #### Examples
- The BMI of an individual who weighs 86 kg and is 1,80 m tall is 86 kg divided by (1,8 m)²:
BMI = 86/(1,80)² = 26,5 = overweight
 - The BMI of an individual who weighs 58 kg and who is 1,63 m tall is 58 kg divided by (1,63 m)²:
BMI = 21,8 = healthy weight range

Tips for teachers

If you are a teacher, especially a high school teacher, use the Study Mate to inspire and prepare your learners to succeed in Grade 12. Preparation for Grade 12 begins in Grade 10. Performance Assessment Tasks

The following subjects have a practical component: Agriculture Management Practice, Agriculture Technology, Computer Applications Technology, Dance, Design, Dramatic Art, Music, Visual Art, Information Technology, Consumer Studies, Hospitality, Tourism, Civil Technology, Electrical Technology, Engineering Graphics and Design and Mechanical Technology. The PATs for these subjects were distributed in 2007 and our learners should be making good progress on them by now.



Tips for toppies

Are you a parent, grandparent, guardian, older sibling or friend of a grade 12 learner? Here are some tips to help them succeed.

- Encourage learners to do homework and study every day
- Find a comfortable, quiet space for learners to study
- Know what is expected at schools for learners (see the tables below for the formal assessment tasks for Grade 10, 11 and 12 learners)
- Support learners throughout the year – spend time with them and encourage them
- Ensure that learners eat well, exercise and have sufficient sleep
