# NATIONAL CERTIFICATES (VOCATIONAL)

**PROGRAMME AND SUBJECT CODES** 

#### 1. INTRODUCTION

This document contains the programme and subject codes of the National Certificates (Vocational) offered by Further Education and Training Colleges for the 2012 academic year onwards. These programme and subject codes form the basis of the computerised examination system. Examination Administrators at Examination Centres must therefore ensure that their computerised system complies with the requirements of the Department of Higher Education and Training (DHET).

The programmes and subjects are structured in such a way that it will assist users with an overview of the compulsory and recommended optional subjects to be offered for a specific programme and clearly indicates the phasing in dates of particular programmes and subjects

This document must be read in conjunction with the following documents:

- National Certificate (Vocational): A qualification at Levels 2, 3, 4 on the NQF, Government Gazette, No. 28677 of 29 March 2006, as amended in, Government Gazette, No.30266 of 7 September 2007; and
- The National Policy on the Conduct, Administration and Management of the Assessment of the National Certificate (Vocational), Government Gazette, No. 30287 of 12 September 2007.
- The Policy Document on, Formal Further Education and Training College Programmes at Levels 2 to 4 on the National Qualifications Framework (NQF) of 18 March 2010, approved in Government Gazette 33220 of 25 May 2010

This memorandum replaces Examination Instruction 05 of 2009.

#### 2. DURATION

The duration of the National Certificate (Vocational) for full-time students is a minimum period of one (1) year. Part-time students may spread their programme over a longer period than one year. A maximum period of three (3) end-of-year examinations will be allowed for the completion of part-time programmes.

#### 3. PROGRAMME REQUIREMENTS

- > A fundamental component comprising of three compulsory subjects selected as follows:
  - One of the eleven official languages listed at <u>Table 5</u> on at least First Additional Language level. The language chosen must be the language of learning and teaching of the institution.
  - Mathematics or Mathematical Literacy listed in Table 6
  - Life Orientation in Table 7.
- > A vocational component comprising of three compulsory subjects and
- One recommended optional vocational subject falling within the programme or any other vocational subject as recommended.

#### 4. PROMOTION AND CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

Obtained at least:

- ➤ 40% in the required official language.
- > 30% in Mathematical Literacy or Mathematics.
- ➤ 40% in Life Orientation.
- > 50% in each of the vocational subjects.

#### 5. CONDONATION

A condonation of a maximum of one (1) fundamental subject will be applied as follows:

- ➤ If a student obtained less than 40% in a Language or Life Orientation, his or her result may be condoned with a maximum of 5% to the required promotion requirement of 40%.
- ➤ If a student obtained less than 30% in Mathematics or Mathematical Literacy, his or her result may be condoned with a maximum of 5% to the required promotion requirement of 30%.

#### 6. PROGRAMME AND SUBJECT CODING FOR PROGRAMMING PURPOSES

#### 6.1 Programmes

The programme codes consist of 9 digits, which have the following meaning:

- > first digit: "5" added to all distinctive FET College programmes
- > second digit: Unique to the NCV programme (either 0 or 2).
- > third digit: NQF level
- > fourth and fifth digit: organising field (Table 1)
- > sixth and seventh digit: sub-field (Table 2)
- > eighth digit: unique programme code.
- > ninth digit: programme identification code (1).

#### 6.2 Subjects

The subject codes consist of 8 digits, which have the following meaning:

- first and second digits: organising field (Table 1);
- > third and fourth digits: the subject groupings or sub-fields, as defined in (Tables 2 and 3);
- > fifth, sixth and seventh digits: unique subject codes; and
- eighth digit: NQF level of the subject.
